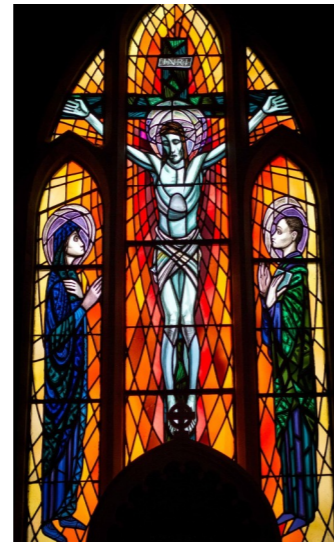

Returning to the New Normal in St Patrick's Aughnagar and St Joseph's Ackinduff - Phase 11

After a review meeting with the Pastoral Council we are delighted to announce that both St Joseph's Ackinduff and St Patrick's Aughnagar will reopen for Public Mass. Our new Mass schedule is as follows:

At this time we are unable to reopen Aughnagar for Sunday morning Mass. Fridays will be reserved for Month Minds and First Anniversaries. These may be celebrated in any of the three churches. We will have another review at the end of October.

Face Coverings

It has become increasingly clear that the wearing of face coverings, in conjunction with hand washing, etc, is likely to reduce the spread of Coronavirus, thus helping to protect others. At this time the wearing of face coverings at services of worship is not mandatory. This is, in part, due to the fact that as churches we are committed to maintaining 2 metre physical distancing between household groups and strict adherence to all government guidance on hand hygiene, cleaning, ventilation, etc. **However, following further recent consultations with public health authorities, Archbishop Eamon Martin is formally recommending and encouraging the use of face coverings at all Masses and other liturgical celebrations.**

I wear my mask in public for 3 reasons:
1. HUMILITY: I don't know if I have COVID as it is clear that people can spread the disease before they have symptoms.
2. KINDNESS: I don't know if the person I am near has a child battling cancer, or cares for their elderly mom. While I might be fine, they might not.
3. COMMUNITY: I want my community to thrive, businesses to stay open, employees to stay healthy. Keeping a lid on COVID helps us all!

Regulations re Funerals, Months Mind & First Anniversary Masses during Covid-19 Pandemic

In line with present guidelines, Social Distancing is to be observed at all times. Wakes/Funerals/Burials are still private to close family members and friends. Face Masks/Coverings should be worn inside the Church. Music should be by soloist/cantor only. When a funeral occurs the 10.00am Mass will be cancelled. Any Mass intention will be included in the funeral Mass.

Collection Boxes

New collection boxes have been placed at the back of the church and also at the exit porch. Please leave your envelope in the box, either as you enter or when you leave. Envelopes can also be left at the Parochial House.

Baptism

Anyone wishing to book a Baptism please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are arranged by appointment only and three weeks notice must be given. **From September they will be held on the second and fourth weekend of every month. Parents, godparents, grandparents and child's siblings should only attend.**

Respect for our Graveyards

Our graveyards are very special to us. It is important to remember that when we visit our graveyards we should always be respectful and ensure that we do not cause damage or harm to any grave or plot. *May they rest in peace.*

World Day of Migrants and Refugees - Sunday 27th September

Pope Francis invites us to be part of a culture of encounter as we welcome, protect, integrate, and promote immigrants and refugees in our midst. There are an estimated 50.8 million internally displaced persons worldwide. Among them, there are 45.7 million displaced due to conflict and violence and 5.1 million who were forced to move because of disasters. Immigration is about real people who are trying to find a better life and a new beginning. Its about families. As Pope Francis stated, *'Each migrant has a name, a face, a story.'*

Mission Month

October is Mission Month, a month where we are called to support and pray with and for our missionaries. Ireland has a long history of missionaries serving in the most deprived parts of the world and this tradition continues today with Irish missionaries working in many developing countries as well as in the developed world with projects that support and enable disadvantaged communities. During this month, parishioners are encouraged to pray for our missionaries abroad and those discerning the vocation to mission - we are also invited to support the work of the missionaries and this can be done on the weekend of October 17/18th where a special collection will be taken up. Next Thursday, October 1st is the feast of St Therese of Lisieux - Patron of the Missions and of Missionaries - Through her intercession we pray for the protection of all Missionaries during this time of Pandemic.
